<p>Risk 1:10</p>			<p>The calculated risk for Trisomy 21 (with nuchal translucency) is below the cut off, which indicates a low risk.</p> <p>After the result of the Trisomy 21 test (with NT) it is expected that among more than 10000 women with the same data, there is one woman with a trisomy 21 pregnancy.</p> <p>The risk for this twin pregnancy has been calculated for a singleton pregnancy with corrected MoMs.</p> <p>The calculated risk by PRISCA depends on the accuracy of the information provided by the referring physician.</p> <p>Please note that risk calculations are statistical approaches and have no diagnostic value!</p> <p>The patient combined risk presumes the NT measurement was done according to accepted guidelines (Prenat Diagn 18: 511-523 (1998)).</p> <p>The laboratory can not be hold responsible for their impact on the risk assessment ! Calculated risks have no diagnostic value!</p>
